

Description of Amended Proclamation House and Senate Districts

[Prepared by the Alaska Redistricting Board – April 5, 2012]

House District 1 – Senate District A – North Pole/Eielson

House District 1 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Nordale Road and Freeman Road, east to the west bank of the Chena River, southeast then northeast to the confluence with Flat Creek, north to Chena Hot Springs Road, northeast to a tractor trail near Stiles Creek, east to the middle fork of the Chena River, northeast to the confluence with Ottertail Creek, north the the headwaters of Ottertail Creek, north along a non-visible line to the Boundary of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, east then south then west to the intersection with the Trans-Alaska Pipeline, northwest to the Little Salcha River, southwest to the Tanana River tributary, south to the east bank of the Tanana River, northwest along the east bank to boundary of Fort Wainwright, north to Piledriver Slough, west to the east bank of the Tanana River, northwest to an unnamed creek near Levee Way, north to the Richardson Highway, east to the boundary of the City of North Pole, northwest to northwestern-most point of the City of North Pole, northeast along a non-visible line to the end of Willeda Street, northeast along a non-visible line to the intersection of Badger Loop Road and Repp Road, east to the eastern bank of the Chena Slough, north to a non-visible line extending from Shavano Lane, north to Shavano Lane, north to Stoneman Lane, east to Benshoof Drive, northwest to Badger Loop Road, north to Candle Lite Loop, east then north to Badger Loop Road, northwest to Nordale Road, north to point of beginning.

House District 2 – Senate District A – Farmers Loop/Two Rivers

House District 2 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the Steese Highway and the City of Fairbanks, west to the boundary of College CDP, northwest to Farmers Loop Road, southwest to Elbert Road, north to Husky Way, west to Scenic Loop, north then southwest to Garden Avenue, south to Farmers Loop Road, west to Pearl Creek, northwest to Auburn Drive, north to Baylor Boulevard, west to Eton Boulevard, north to DePauw Drive, northwest to Herried Road, east to the end of Herried Road, north along a non-visible line to the intersection of Wolverine Lane and Red Fox Drive, northwest to Ballaine Road, north to Goldstream Creek, northeast to the boundary of Goldstream CDP, east then north then west to a jeep trail near Any Creek, north then west to Our Creek, north to the confluence with the Chatanika River, west to the boundary of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, north then east to the boundary of House District 1, southwest to the intersection of Nordale Road and Badger Loop Road, northwest to Markey Road, west to Lakloey Drive, northwest to Badger Road, east to Old Badger Road, east to Canoro Road, north to Michael Lane, west to the end of Michael Lane, west along a non-visible line to the eastern bank of the Chena River, north to the confluence with an unnamed creek, northwest to Homestead Road, north to a jeep trail, northwest to the boundary of the City of Fairbanks, north then west to Fair Place, west to Kniffen Road, west to the Steese Highway, south to point of beginning.

House District 3 – Senate District B – Fairbanks/Wainwright

House District 3 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Airport Way and the Richardson and Steese Highways, north to east bank of the Chena River, northwest to the confluence with Noyes Slough, north along the east bank to College Road, northwest to Margaret Avenue, north to the end of Margaret Avenue, north along a non-visible line to Isabella Creek, east then north to the boundary of the City of Fairbanks, east to the Steese Highway, north to Kniffen Road, east to Fair Place, east to the boundary of the City of Fairbanks, east then south to a jeep trail near Columbia Creek, east to Homestead Road, south to an unnamed creek, southeast to the Chena River, south along the east bank to a non-visible line extending from Michael Lane, east to Michael Lane, east to Canoro Road, south to Old Badger Road, southwest to Badger Road, west to Lakloey Drive, south to Markey Road, east to Badger Loop Road, southeast to Candle Lite Loop, east then south to Badger Loop Road, south to Benshoof Drive, south to Stoneman Lane, west to Shavano Lane, south to the end of Shavano Lane, south along a non-visible line to Chena Slough, south along the east bank of Chena Slough to Repp Road, west to the intersection of Repp Road and Badger Loop Road, southwest along a non-visible line to the end of Willeda Street, southwest along a non-visible line to the boundary of the City of North Pole, south to the Richardson Highway, west to an unnamed creek near Levee Way, south to the east bank of the Tanana River, west to the boundary of Fort Wainwright at Bonnifield Trail, north to the Richardson Highway, north to point of beginning.

House District 4 – Senate District B – City of Fairbanks

House District 4 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Pomm Road and Lathrop Street, north to an unnamed creek near Queens Way, northwest to Bonita Street, north to the boundary of the City of Fairbanks, west then north to the Chena River, north along University Avenue to the west bank of the Chena River, northeast to the boundary of the City of Fairbanks, north then east then south to the west bank of the Chena River near Pine Street, north then east to Isabella Creek, west to a non-visible line extending from the end of Margaret Avenue, south to Margaret Avenue, south to College Road, southeast to the east bank of Noyes Slough, south to the confluence with the Chena River, southeast along the east bank to the Steese Highway, south along the Steese/Richardson Highways to the boundary of Fort Wainwright, east then south to the Tanana River, west along the north bank of the Tanana River to an unnamed road south of Cinch Street, north to Cinch Street, north to Pomm Road, west to point of beginning.

House District 5 – Senate District C – Chena Ridge

House District 5 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the George Parks Highway and Ester Road, east to the Alaska Railroad, northwest to Sheep Creek Road, east to a 4x4 trail, north to Goldstream Creek, northeast to Ballaine Road, south to Red Fox Road, south to the intersection of Red Fox Road and La Rue Lane, south along a non-visible line to the end of Herreid Road, west to De Pauw Drive, southeast to Eton Boulevard, south to Baylor Boulevard, west to Auburn Drive, south to Pearl Creek, south to Farmers Loop Road, east to Garden Avenue, north to Scenic Loop, north then east to Husky Way, east to Elbert Road, south to Farmers Loop Road, northeast to the boundary of College CDP, south to the boundary of the City of Fairbanks, southwest to the east bank of the Chena River near Chief

William Drive, west then south to University Avenue, south to the boundary of the City of Fairbanks, south then east to Bonita Street, south to an unnamed creek, southeast to Lathrop Street, south to Pomm Road, east to Cinch Street, south to an unnamed road, south to the Tanana River, east along the east bank of the Tanana River to the boundary of Fort Wainwright near the Old Richardson Highway, south to the east bank of the Tanana River, south to the Tanana River Tributary near Starkeyville Lane, north to the Little Salcha River, east to the Trans-Alaska Pipeline, southeast to the boundary of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, south then west then north to the west bank of the Tanana River near the Parks Highway, northeast to Crosie Creek, north to the Parks Highway, northwest to the intersection of the Parks Highway and Milkmaid Lane, south then east along the Ester CDP boundary to Aspenwood Drive, east to Cripple Creek Road, north to the Parks Highway, northeast to the point of beginning.

House District 6 – Senate District C – Richardson Highway

House District 6 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the Richardson Highway and the Fairbanks North Star Borough boundary, northeast to the Dot Lake Precinct, south to the Mentasta Precinct, south to the boundary of the Valdez-Cordova Census Area, west to the Richardson Highway, southeast to the TAPS, south to TAPS Road, southwest to the Richardson Highway, south to the TAPS, south to 22 Apl-1 Road, east to Dry Creek, southeast to the Copper River, south along the western bank of the Copper River to the boundary of Tazlina CDP, west to the TAPS, south to the boundary of Copper Center Precinct, east to the Copper River, southeast along the western bank of the Copper River to the boundary of Kenny Lake CDP, southwest to the boundary of Tonsina CDP, southeast then southwest to Haley Creek, southeast to an unnamed road near the Copper River, southwest to the Uranatina River, south to the Copper River, south along the western bank of the Copper River to the boundary of Valdez No. 3 Precinct, south then west to the boundary of Valdez No. 1 Precinct, west then north to the northern shoreline of Valdez Arm, southwest then north to Columbia Glacier, north along the eastern edge of Columbia Glacier to the boundary of Glennallen Precinct, west then north to the boundary of the Matanuska Susitna Borough, west to Glacier Fork, northwest to Metal Creek, north to the headwaters of Metal Creek, west along a non-visible line to the headwaters of Carpenter Creek, north to the Matanuska River, southwest along the northern bank of the Matanuska River to a foot trail near Palmer-Fishhook Road, west to Palmer-Fishhook Road, west to Werner Road, north to Biscane Drive, east to Monte Carlo Lane, north to Corvette Drive, west to the end of Corvette Drive, west then north along a non-visible line to the intersection of Fence Line Drive and Farm Loop Road, north then east to Britchenstrap Drive, north to the boundary of Buffalo Soapstone CDP, west to the boundary of Fishhook CDP, south then west to the boundary of Pioneer Peak Precinct, northwest to East Aspen Ridge Road, west to Engstrom Road, south to Hart Lake Loop, west to the boundary of Fishhook CDP, west to Sorrelwood Street, north along a non-visible line to East Pamela Drive, west along East Pamela Drive to the boundary of Tanaina CDP, north to an unnamed road near Donofrio Lane, northwest to North Champion Road, north to Coles Patton Extension, west to North Champion Road, north to an unnamed road, east to the boundary of Tanaina CDP, north to the boundary of Willow CDP, north to the confluence of Bartholf Creek and the Kashwitna River, north along a non-visible line to the headwaters of Sheep Creek, west to Iron Creek Trail, north to the Sheep River, northwest to the boundary of Chase CDP, northeast then northwest to the Susitna River, northeast along the eastern bank of the Susitna River to the Alaska Railroad, north to the George Parks

Highway, north to the boundary of the Denali Borough, east then north to the boundary of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, east to the point of beginning.

House District 7 – Senate District D – Rural Mat-Su

House District 7 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Greentree Street and Bogard Road, west to Seldon Road, west to Locharron Drive, west to Lucille Street, south to Gail Drive, west to Gwene Lane, south to West Rockside Road, south to Spruce Avenue, west to the boundary of the City of Wasilla, north and west to Church Road, south to Ben Hogan Avenue, west to the boundary of the City of Wasilla, west and south to Neuser Road, west to the George Parks Highway, west to an unnamed creek, north to Kalmbach Jeep Trail, north to Beverly Lake Road, west to Wyoming Drive, north to Starr Road, west to a foot trail, northwest to Little Lake, west along the southern shore of Little Lake to an unnamed creek, south west to North Pitman Road, north to Peninsula Drive, west to Island Lake Drive, north east to Tote Street, north to North Sasbo Bluff Road, west then north to Silver Drive, west along a non-visible line to the Little Susitna River, west along the southern bank of the Little Susitna River to the boundary of the City of Houston, south then west to the boundary of Willow CDP, west to the Susitna River, south along the eastern bank of the Susitna River to the outlet into Cook Inlet, southeast along a non-visible line to the boundary of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, west, north and east along the boundary of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough to the George Parks Highway, south to the Alaska Railroad crossing north of Pass Creek, south to the Susitna River, south along the eastern bank of the Susitna River to the boundary of Chase CDP, southeast to the Sheep River, southeast to Iron Creek Trail, southwest to Sheep Creek, south to the headwaters of Sheep Creek, south along a non-visible line to the confluence Bartholf Creek and the Kashwitna River, south along Bartholf Creek to the boundary of Farm Loop Precinct, south to the boundary of Fishhook Precinct, south to the boundary of Tanaina CDP, south to an unnamed road near North Champion Road, west to North Champion Road, south to Coles Patton Extension, east to North Champion Road, south to an unnamed road, east to the boundary of Tanaina CDP, south to Pamela Drive, east to a non-visible line extending north from Sorrelwood Street, south to the boundary of Lakes CDP, east to Hart Lake Loop, east to the Engstrom Road Extension, south along a non-visible line to Niklason Lake, west to a non-visible line extending north from North Sylvanne Court, south to North Sylvanne Court, south to Breezewood Road, southeast to Zephyr Drive, east to Engstrom Road, south to Bogard Road, west to point of beginning.

House District 8 – Senate District D – Greater Palmer

House District 8 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Seward Meridian Road and the Palmer-Wasilla Highway, east to Hyer Road, south to Lower Road, south to East Jean Drive, east to South Megan Way, northwest to a non-visible line, north to Tiffany Drive, northeast to Wasilla Creek, northeast to an unnamed street near Little Brook Lane, west to the boundary of Lakes CDP, north to Bogard Road, west to Engstrom Road, north to Zephyr Drive, west to Breezewood Road, north to North Sylvanne Court, north to the end of North Sylvanne Court, north along a non-visible line to the north shore of Niklason Lake, east to a non-visible line extending south from the Engstrom Road Extension, north to the Engstrom Road Extension, north to East Aspen Ridge Road, east to a non-visible line south

of East Alyeska Drive, southeast to the boundary of Farm Loop CDP, north then east to the boundary of Buffalo Soapstone CDP, east to Britchenstrap Road, south to Farm Loop Road, west then south to the intersection of Farm Loop Road and Fence Line Drive, south then east along a non-visible line to the end of Corvette Drive, east along Corvette Drive to Monte Carlo Lane, south to Biscane Drive, west to Werner Road, south to Palmer-Fishhook Road, east to a foot trail, east to the west bank of the Matanuska River, south along the western bank of the Matanuska River to Dike Road, northwest to Grandview Drive, northeast to the Alaska Railroad, west to a non-visible line extending north from the intersection of East Nelson Road and Wasilla Creek, south to Wasilla Creek, west to an embankment south of East Fetlock Drive, southwest to the boundary of Knik-Fairview CDP, north to the Alaska Railroad, west to the boundary of the City of Wasilla, north to the intersection of Seward Meridian Parkway and Tamarack Drive, north on Seward Meridian Parkway to point of beginning.

House District 9 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Gail Drive and Lucille Street, north to Locharron Drive, southeast to East Seldon Road, east to Bogard Road, east to the boundary of Gateway CDP, south to its second intersection with North Tiffany Drive, southwest to a non-visible line extending south to South Megan Way, southwest to East Jean Drive, southwest to South Lower Road, west to Hyer Road, north to the Palmer-Wasilla Highway, west to Seward Meridian Parkway, south to the boundary of the City of Wasilla, south then west to the intersection of South Heritage Farm Road and Knik-Goose Bay Road, southwest to South Clapp Street, north to Donovan Drive, southwest to Saindon Street, north to Hatcher Pass Street, north to Teeland Street, west to Link Street, north to West Sweet Birch Avenue, west to South Green Birch Lane, north to Range View Drive, west to Foothills Boulevard, north to Paddy Place, east to South Bettina Way, north to West Museum Drive, east to the boundary of the City of Wasilla, north then east to Church Road, north to the boundary of the City of Wasilla south of Carlsbad Place, east then south to North Rockside Road, north to Gwene Lane, north to West Gail Drive, east to point of beginning.

House District 10 – Senate District E – Big Lake/Point MacKenzie

House District 10 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of West Beverly Lake Drive and Wyoming Drive, east to Kalmbach Jeep Trail, south to an unnamed creek, south to the West George Parks Highway, east to West Museum Drive, east to South Bettina Way, south to Paddy Place, west to Foothills Boulevard, south to Range View Drive, east to South Green Birch Lane, south to West Sweet Birch Avenue, east to Link Street, south to Teeland Street, east to Hatcher Pass Street, south to Saindon Street, south to Donovan Drive, east to South Clapp Street, south to Knik-Goose Bay Road, southwest to West Birch Harbor Drive, south to Binnacle Drive, west to Outrigger Drive, southwest to West Compass Drive, northwest to Knik-Goose Bay Road, southwest to Settlers Bay Road, south to South Settlers Bay Drive, east to an easement trail extending south along South Settlers Bay Drive to Crocker Creek, south to Knik Arm, south along a non-visible line to the boundary of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, west to a non-visible line extending south from the eastern bank of the Susitna River, north along the eastern bank of the Susitna River to the boundary of Willow CDP, east to the boundary of the City of Houston, southeast

then north to the Little Susitna River, east along the southern bank of the Little Susitna River to a non-visible line extending from West Silver Drive, east to Sasbo Bluff Road, south to Tote Street, south to Island Lake Drive, southwest to West Peninsula Drive, east to Pittman Road, south to an unnamed creek flowing from Little Lake, northeast to Little Lake, east along the southern shore of Little Lake to a foot trail, southeast to Starr Road, east to Wyoming Drive, south to point of beginning.

House District 11 – Senate District F – Butte/Chugiak

House District 11 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the Glenn Highway and Peters Creek, northwest to Knik Arm, north along a non-visible line to the boundary of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, southwest to a non-visible line extending from the mouth of Crocker Creek, northeast to South Settlers Bay Drive, east then north to an easement trail, north to Settlers Bay Drive, west to Settlers Bay Road, north to Knik-Goose Bay Road, northeast to West Compass Drive, southeast to Outrigger Drive, northeast to South Binnacle Drive, east to West Birch Harbor Drive, north to Knik-Goose Bay Road, northeast to the boundary of the City of Wasilla, north then east to the Alaska Railroad, east to the boundary of Gateway CDP, south to an embankment, northeast to Wasilla Creek, east to a non-visible line starting at the end of East Nelson Road, north to the Alaska Railroad, east to Grandview Drive, south to Dike Road, southeast to Rabbit Slough, east to the Matanuska River, northeast along the western bank of the Matanuska River to the confluence with Carpenter Creek, southeast to the headwaters of Carpenter Creek, east along a non-visible line to the headwaters of Metal Creek, south to Glacier Fork, southeast to the boundary of the Municipality of Anchorage, south to the boundary of Chugach National Forest, west to the boundary of Chugach Park No.1 Precinct, northwest to Peters Creek, northwest to the boundary of the Chugiak Community Council, southwest to Parks Creek, west to the Glenn Highway, northeast to point of beginning.

House District 12 – Senate District F – Eagle River

House District 12 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the Glenn Highway and Parks Creek, east along Parks Creek to the boundary of the Chugiak Community Council, north then east to Peters Creek, southeast to the boundary of Chugach Park No. 1 Precinct, southwest to Meadow Creek, west to East Eagle River Loop Road, northwest to Dawn Street, south to Coronado Road, west to the Old Glenn Highway, southwest to the Glenn Highway, north to a non-visible line extending from the west end of Farm Avenue to the boundary of Fort Richardson, west to the boundary of Fort Richardson, south to the Glenn Highway, southwest to the boundary of Fort Richardson, west then north to Knik Arm, northwest along a non-visible line to the boundary of the Municipality of Anchorage, northeast to a non-visible line extending north from the mouth of Peters Creek, southeast to the mouth of Peters Creek, southeast to the Glenn Highway, southwest to point of beginning.

House District 13 – Senate District G – Elmendorf

House District 13 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Debarr Road and Edward Street, north to East 6th Avenue, east to Donna Drive, north to Krane Drive, north to Donna Drive, east to Turpin

Street, north to the boundary of Elmendorf AFB, west then north to a non-visible line north of Tidewater Road, west to the boundary of the Municipality of Anchorage, northeast to the boundary of Fort Richardson Precinct, southeast to the boundary of Fort Richardson, south then west to the Peck Avenue Extension, southwest to the boundary of Fort Richardson, south to a non-visible line extending east from Debarr Road, west to Debarr Road, west to point of beginning.

District 14 – Senate District G – College Gate

House District 14 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Baxter Road and Tudor Road, west to Boniface Parkway, north to East 38th Court, west along a non-visible line extending from East 38th Court to Lynn Drive, north to Sydnie Kay Street, west to Checkmate Drive, north to the southern branch of Chester Creek, southwest to Queens Court, west to Wesleyan Drive, south to the southern branch of Chester Creek, southwest to the boundary of Alaska Pacific University, north to a non-visible line extending from the boundary of Alaska Pacific University to East Northern Lights Boulevard, north along a non-visible line to South Pine Street, north to a non-visible line extending to the extension of South Pine Street south of the intersection with Debarr Road, north to McCarrey Street, north to the boundary of Elmendorf AFB, east to Turpin Street, south to Donna Drive, west to Krane Drive, south to Donna Drive, south to East 6th Avenue, west to Edward Street, south to Debarr Road, east to Beaver Place, south to Baxter Road, south to point of beginning.

House District 15 – Senate District H – University

House District 15 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Tudor Road and Elmore Road, south to Dowling Road, west to the New Seward Highway, north to Tudor Road, east to MacInnes Street, north to Crescent Drive, west to Locarno Drive, north to East 36th Avenue, west to Latouche Street, north to East Benson Boulevard, east to East Northern Lights, east to South Bragaw Street, north to East 16th Avenue, east to South Hoyt Street, north to a non-visible line extending northwest from Bliss Drive, southeast to Bliss Drive, east to Bliss Circle, east along a non-visible line extending from the end of Bliss Circle to a non-visible line extending north from Pine Street to the end of an extension of South Pine Street south of Debarr Road, south to the end of Pine Street extending north of the intersection with East 26th Avenue, south along a non-visible line extending from the intersection of Pine Street and East 26th Avenue to East Northern Lights Boulevard, south along a non-visible line to the boundary of Alaska Pacific University, south to the southern branch of Chester Creek, northeast to Wesleyan Drive, north to Queens Court, east to the southern branch of Chester Creek, northeast to Checkmate Drive, south to Sydnie Kay Street, east to Lynn Drive, south to East 38th Court, east along a non-visible line connecting to East 38th Court, east to Boniface Parkway, south to Tudor Road, west to point of beginning.

House District 16 – Senate District H – Spenard

House District 16 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Lake Otis Parkway and East Northern Lights Boulevard, west to East Benson Boulevard, southwest to Latouche Street, south to East

36th Avenue, east to Locarno Drive, south to Crescent Avenue, east to MacInnes Street, south to East Tudor Road, west to Minnesota Drive, north to Fish Creek, southwest to the Alaska Railroad, northwest to Spenard Road, southwest to Fish Creek, north to West Northern Lights Boulevard, west to Forrest Park Drive, north to Fish Creek, north to Knik Arm, northeast 8
along the shoreline to the mouth of Chester Creek, southeast to West Chester Lagoon, southeast along the southern shore of West Chester Lagoon to Chester Creek, east to East Northern Lights Boulevard, west to point of beginning.

House District 17 – Senate District I – Mountainview

House District 17 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Debarr Road and Airport Heights Drive, north to the Glenn Highway, west to Reeve Boulevard, north to the boundary of Elmendorf AFB, east to McCarrey Street, south to South Pine Street, south to the end of South Pine Street, south along a non-visible line to a non-visible line extending east from Bliss Circle, west along a non-visible line to Bliss Circle, northwest to Bliss Drive, west to the end of Bliss Drive, northwest along a non-visible line to South Hoyt Street, south to East 16th Avenue, west to South Bragaw Street, south to East Northern Lights Boulevard, west to the southern fork of Chester Creek, northwest to Lake Otis Parkway, north to East 16th Avenue, east to Alder Drive, north to East 15th Avenue, east to Birchwood Street, north to Debarr Road, east to point of beginning.

House District 18 – Senate District I – Downtown

House District 18 is bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the Glenn Highway and Airport Heights Drive, south to Debarr Road, west to Birchwood Street, south to East 15th Avenue, west to Alder Street, south to East 16th Avenue, west to Lake Otis Parkway, south to Chester Creek, west to West Chester Lagoon, west along the southern shore of West Chester Lagoon to the outlet, west to Knik Arm, northeast along the eastern shoreline of Knik Arm to a non-visible line extending west from the end of West 2nd Avenue, northwest to the boundary of the Municipality of Anchorage, northeast to the boundary of Elmendorf Precinct, east to the boundary of Elmendorf AFB, south then east to Reeve Boulevard, south to the Glenn Highway, east to point of beginning.

House District 19 – Senate District J – West Anchorage

House District 37 includes all uplands and islands bounded by a line beginning at northwest corner of the City of Bethel, southeast along the boundary of House District 36 to the eastern boundary of the Lake and Peninsula Borough, southwest through the Aleutian Chain, across the Bering Sea to the Pribilof Islands and Nunivak Island, southeast along the 3 mile sea limit to the a non-visible line extending south from the centerline of the Kuskokwim River, north along the boundary of House District 36 to point of beginning.

House District 38 – Wade Hampton/McKinley

House District 38 includes all uplands and islands bounded by a line starting at the point where the Alaska Railroad crosses the southern boundary of the Denali Borough, southwest to the boundary of the

Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area, south to House District 36, west to the southwest corner of Wade Hampton Census Area, west to St. Matthew Island, northeast to the common boundary of the Calista ANRC and Bering Straits ANRC, east to the boundary of the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area, north to the boundary of the Yukon-Koyukuk School District, east to Timber Creek, north to the confluence of Bonanza Creek, east to a jeep trail, north to the Ruby-Poorman Road, north to the boundary of the City of Ruby, west then north to the south bank of the Yukon River, east to the confluence of Big Creek, north along a non-visible line to the north bank of the Yukon River, northeast to the boundary of the City of Tanana, north then east then south to the north bank of the Yukon River, northeast to the boundary of Yukon Flats School District, east to the boundary of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, south to the Chatanika River, east to the confluence of Our Creek, south to a jeep trail, south to Old Murphy Dome Road, south to the boundary of Goldstream CDP, east then south to an abandoned railroad, west to Silver Creek, south to the confluence of Goldstream Creek, southwest to a 4x4 trail near the Alaska Railroad, south to Sheep Creek Road, west to the Alaska Railroad, southeast to the Ester Road, west to the Parks Highway, southwest to Cripple Creek Road, southwest to Aspenwood Drive, west to the boundary of Ester CDP, north to the Parks Highway, west to Crosie Creek, south to the north bank of the Tanana River, west to the boundary of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, southeast to the boundary of the Denali Borough, east then south then west to the point of beginning.

House District 39 – Senate District T – Bering Straits/Interior Villages

House District 39 includes all uplands and islands bounded by a line beginning at the northeast corner of the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area, south to the boundary of Ahtna ANRC, south to the boundary of Chugach ANRC, northwest to the boundary of House District 6, north to the boundary of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, northeast then west to the boundary of House District 38, west to the boundary of the Nome Census Area, includes all of the Nome Census Area including Gambell, Diomedes, and all other islands within the Nome Census Area, northwest then southeast to the boundary of the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area, northeast to point of beginning.

House District 40 – Senate District T – Arctic

House District 40 includes all uplands and islands within the Northwest Arctic Borough and North Slope Borough.
