## Position Statement

I am running to represent Interior Alaska because our region needs education funding, responsible economic development, and a voice for our subsistence resources and rights as rural Alaskans. I have spent my life seeing the impact of these needs and I am ready to go to work in the Legislature to put our district's needs FIRST.

My main goals are to:

–Support education–by supporting a permanent BSA funding increase for public schools, restoring defined benefits, and adopting a supplemental benefit system (SBS) for state employees.
