Alaska Judicial Council Evaluation

Judge Michael B. Logue, Anchorage District Court

The Alaska Judicial Council finds Judge Logue met or exceeded performance standards and recommends a “YES” vote for another term as judge.

Judge Logue was appointed to the Anchorage District Court in 2018. This is his second retention election. He is a trial court judge handling civil and criminal cases.

Performance Summary

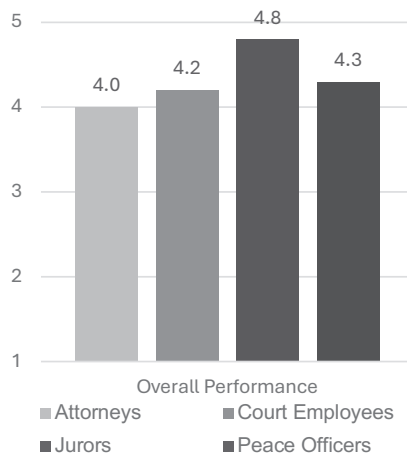
Judge Logue met or exceeded the performance standards of legal ability, integrity, impartiality, fairness, temperament, diligence and administrative skills, and overall performance. Judge Logue also met or exceeded educational requirements set by the Alaska Supreme Court.

Performance Findings: The Judicial Council’s evaluation of Judge Logue included reviews from attorneys, court employees, jurors, and peace officers. Judge Logue received good ratings from individuals in these groups who had direct experience with his work.

The Council reviewed other performance measures, including Judge Logue’s financial and conflict of interest statements, whether pay was withheld for untimely decisions, appellate reversal rates, disqualifications from cases, and public ethics files. The Council found no matters of concern in these areas.

Professional Activities: Judge Logue presided over two therapeutic courts that use special procedures to handle cases involving individuals with mental health or substance abuse issues.
